Tyneside Cinema is the North East's leading independent cinema located in the heart of Newcastle upon Tyne where it provides a welcoming space for people from all walks of life to come together.

In 2026, the doors will open to the Tyneside Talent Unit housed within the Tyneside Cinema. This will offer unique talent development opportunities for young people aspiring to work within the screen & content industry in state-of-the-art facilities.

The Talent Unit Engagement Lead will be responsible for identifying emerging local young talent, marginalised voices and disadvantaged young people to be recruited into the Talent Unit and support their journey. The role will work collaboratively to ensure a joined up, cohesive and ambitious approach to talent development within the region.



ABOUT THE ROLE

Key Responsibilities

- Identify local young talent, marginalised voices and disadvantaged young people to be recruited into the Talent Unit programme, from identified areas of higher deprivation in the North East.
- Support in the creation of a talent development strategy for the Talent Unit.
- Conduct extensive community outreach for the Talent Unit, targeting disadvantaged areas in the North and young people not currently within the filmmaking community.
- Develop opportunities, cultivate new relationships and employ creative methods for identifying new talent outside of usual routes of film talent development
- Cultivate relationships with individuals, charities, schools, agencies and organisations to foster collaboration.
- Support the development and implementation of best practices for community engagement processes.
- Place inclusion and diversity at the core of outreach and funding activity, ensuring opportunities are as accessible as possible, and under-represented groups are actively engaged with at every stage.
- Create a positive experience for local filmmaking talent and establish the Talent Unit as synonymous with equality, diversity and accessibility
- Remain responsive, knowledgeable and aware of changes and developments within the film industry.
- Play an active role in strategic planning processes and be responsible for completion of operating plans, budgets and reporting.
- Recruit, onboard and manage facilitators to deliver workshops as part of programmes, ensuring they deliver with inclusion, strong values and accessibility at the core.
- Provide creative and practical support to encourage early-career filmmakers, writers and artists working across different creative disciplines to apply for funding opportunities.
- Offer innovative and creative ideas to further develop talent development in the North.
- Feed into any specific funding reporting, and share any required, relevant information with partners.
- Participate in training and seek ways to develop the role, in negotiation with the Talent Unit team.
